### FIZZ

2006 Charles Heidsieck, Blanc des Millénaires £149

One of the great names of Champagne, founded in 1851 by Charles-Camille Heidsieck, the original 'Champagne Charlie', the foundation of its modern fame rests on the unrivalled quality of its wines, which receive countless awards and accolades year after year. The masterpiece is the Blanc des Millénaires. Only released in special vintages, it is made of the best Chardonnay from the Côte des Blancs. The 2016 is an elegant and distinctive Blanc de Blancs, showcasing an opulent aromatic profile and a silky texture so characteristic of this rare cuvée.

### WHITE

2014 Dreissigacker, 'Morstein' Rheinhessen Riesling Trocken £79

As an organic estate, following biodynamic principles, Dreissigacker's approach is as natural as possible, using only wild yeasts, harvesting grapes at optimum ripeness and fermenting to full dryness. This produces a full flavoured, but elegant Riesling, with citrus aromas, a steely minerality and lively acidity.

2018 Jean-Noël Gagnard, Chassagne-Montrachet La Boudriotte 1er Cru £109

This famous domaine is certified organic and is run biodynamically with low intervention. From a Premier Cru vineyard, 'La Boudriotte', the wine perfectly expresses the character of its site. It has an elegant nose with fragrant aromas of white flowers, hazelnut and lemon sherbet. It is rich and silky in the mouth, with a long, layered finish.

### RED

2018 Ata Rangi, Martinborough Pinot Noir £76

Only the oldest and best parcels of fruit are used in this limited release Pinot Noir, which is consistently ranked as one of New Zealand's best. The fabled Abel clone, allegedly smuggled from Burgundy in the mid-70s, makes up 40% of the blend and gives a complex, beautifully perfumed and structured wine. Notes of plums, exotic five spice and liquorice, full flavours of rose hip and dark plums, with fine savoury tannins and fresh acidity that carries the wine to a long, elegant finish.

2015 Château Durfort-Vivens, Margaux 2ème Cru Classé £99

One of the finest estates in Margaux, the wines of Château Durfort-Vivens have all the anticipated elegance and perfume of this appellation. A blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc, it has concentration and balance.

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2016 Gaja, Barolo 'Dagromis'

£115

The power of Serralunga and the elegance of La Morra meet in this captivating Barolo from the renowned Angelo Gaja. On the nose, delightful aromas of redcurrant combine with floral and balsamic notes. On the palate, this wine is structured and well-defined.

2015 Henschke, 'Mount Edelstone' Eden Valley Shiraz

One of Australia's most sought-after wines, this single vineyard Shiraz has distinctive aromas of sage and crushed black pepper, with spiced plum and black cherry characters, enveloped by crushed herbs and cedar. Vibrant, wild forest berries are layered beautifully into a rich and elegantly textured palate with fine velvety tannins and lingering notes of black pepper and sage for an extremely long finish.

2011 Biondi-Santi, Brunello di Montalcino

The wines from this fabled estate are among the very best in Montalcino. 2011 was a warm vintage that produced a full wine that is drinking beautifully now. The bouquet is a generous mix of fruity and floral notes, including scents of black cherries, blood orange and wild flowers. The structured palate is savoury and driven by an elegant freshness and silky tannins which lead toward a long-lingering finish.
